OU Executive Summary

Project Title HAITI FY 2011 Country Operational Plan (COP)

Background

Haiti is a Caribbean country with a population of more than 9 million people. In 2008, an estimated 2.2 percent of the adult population in Haiti was infected with HIV/AIDS. In the same year there were an estimated 110,000 individuals ages 15 and older and 6,800 children ages 0 to 14, currently living with HIV/AIDS. Additionally, 3.1 percent of females and 1.1 percent of males ages 15-24 years are HIV-positive. The epidemic, that began in Haiti in the early 1980s, continues to be felt throughout the nation, with 7,500 AIDS deaths in 2008 (UNAIDS 2009). In addition to high prevalence levels of HIV/AIDS, Haiti has the highest incidence of tuberculosis (TB) in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) region with a rate of 306 cases per 100,000. An estimated 20 percent of these patients are co-infected with HIV.

Although transmission of HIV/AIDS in Haiti is primarily via heterosexual contact and from mother-to-child, there are additional identifiable high-risk groups that warrant special attention. Groups include: commercial sex workers and their clients and partners; uniformed personnel including members of the police force and border and customs agencies; long distance truck drivers; men who have sex with men; bus drivers; and migrant workers. Youth are also at high risk as they often have an early age of sexual debut, multiple sexual partners, and often engage in transactional sex as a means to pay for school or to support other family members. In addition, discordant couples, where one partner is sero-positive and the other is sero-negative, have become a growing concern in Haiti, where multiple, concurrent relationships are the norm. Condom use is low among both youth and adults further complicating the problem.

Since 2005, the PEPFAR Haiti team has implemented a successful program that has contributed positively to a decline in HIV prevalence in Haiti from 6.1 percent in 2001 to 2.2 percent in 2008. With a clear vision Haiti PEPFAR has worked together with the Haitian Ministry of Health (MOH) and the Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (Global Fund) to implement a comprehensive and integrated national HIV/AIDS prevention, care and treatment program through 40 partners (mostly local NGOs) and 200 sub-partners. As of September 2010, 27,000 of the estimated 50,000 Haitians eligible for antiretroviral therapy (ART) were receiving ART through support from PEPFAR and the Global Fund.

This success has been achieved despite considerable setbacks. In January 2010, a devastating earthquake struck Haiti destroying homes and government buildings in the Port-au-Prince metropolitan and outlying areas. According to national authorities, more than 200,000 persons died and an additional 300,000 persons were injured as a result of the quake. Close to 600,000 internally displaced persons have moved to Departments not affected by the earthquake, placing significant pressure on host populations and local health care services across the country. In addition, large portions of the MOH infrastructure, including records and systems, were destroyed in the earthquake, further weakening already fragile systems. An important part of the reconstruction effort will include rebuilding and strengthening the MOH, including primary care facilities and departmental level secondary/tertiary facilities, the Blood Bank, the University Hospital in Port-au-Prince, and the National Center for Health Sciences.

During the rebuilding period, PEPFAR funding will continue to focus on prevention, care and treatment programs in order to continue guaranteeing proper identification and care for HIV/AIDS patients and achieving PEPFAR goals and objectives.



Sustainability and Country Ownership

In 2009, the USG started discussions with the GOH around building a Partnership Framework (PF) to advance Haiti's ownership of its response to HIV/AIDS. The PF outlines mutual commitments and responsibilities of all key stakeholders, builds upon relationships with parliamentary committees of the National Assembly, and incorporates activities of civil society, private sector, inter-faith groups, bilateral and multilateral development partners, and the Haiti Global Fund Country Coordinating Mechanism (CCM).

The PF aims to achieve five goals, all of which align with the six objectives of the Government of Haiti (GOH) five year strategic plan (2008-2013). Goals include:

- focusing on prevention efforts,
- increasing integration of HIV/AIDS response into the non-HIV health sector,
- strengthening the health care system at all levels,
- expanding access to quality services in care and treatment, and
- establishing a regional and sub-regional collaboration to control HIV transmission and addressing its effect on migrant populations.

Unfortunately, following the change in government in October 2009 and the January 2010 earthquake, further negotiations surrounding the PF have stalled as the MOH's focus has shifted to implementing emergency recovery programs. Despite the halt in PF discussions, the GOH is making important steps towards country ownership including directly managing a portion of PEPFAR funding by way of three CDC cooperative agreements (CoAgs). These CoAgs will reinforce public health labs, manage the blood safety program, reinforce the HIV program through health systems strengthening, and expand HIV care and treatment services through the public facilities. This CDC mechanism has been instrumental in making resources directly available to the central directorates of the MOH to manage the program, and produce the necessary norms, policies and tools to implement programmatic activities. Through these CoAgs, resources have also been directed to departmental directorates to coordinate program activities at the local level. As a result, the GOH is becoming better positioned to plan and manage the program, while the NGOs, which are mostly Haitian, continue to play an important role in HIV service delivery.

In addition to the activities funded by the CoAgs, the GOH, through the Prime Minister's Office, has made HIV/AIDS a national priority and is committed to establishing a multi-sectoral National AIDS Commission. When established, the Commission will provide the high-level of visibility and coordination that is needed for the GOH to take an effective leadership role in the national response. Given the post earthquake and current political environment, actual plans for the Commission have not yet materialized. In the mean time, the GOH will continue to provide in-kind support in the form of medical and administrative personnel placed at public hospital sites as their major contribution to prevention efforts. Given the current environment, it is unlikely that a specific line item will be created in the national budget to support an HIV/AIDS prevention program. The USG will continue to pursue a dialogue with the GOH and key stakeholders towards creating the National AIDS Commission and to inquire about financial commitments and plans for supporting and funding the HIV/AIDS program.

PEPFAR resources will also be allocated to create a critical mass of trained personnel who are implementing innovative ideas such as task-shifting to make the health care system function more efficiently. A residency training program in HIV clinical care and infectious diseases, and a nurse practitioner training program are also well underway. Well trained clinical personnel will help to sustain existing gains made in HIV care and treatment.

Integration across the USG

The PEPFAR Haiti team is working with several other USG programs to ensure full integration of health

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with other programs. The PEPFAR Haiti team works with the Nutrition Directorate of the Ministry of Health to develop guidelines and tool kits for nutritional screening and assessment. PEPFAR Haiti has moved further to contribute to the development of educational materials on nutrition for the general population, including children and adults. The PEPFAR program has worked with PL-480 Title II partners and UN agencies (UNICEF. World Food Program) in food distribution to pregnant women and children infected or affected by HIV and TB, and malnourished children by means of ready-to-use therapeutic feeding. PEPFAR Haiti has also been working with the USAID Education Team to share information about orphans and vulnerable children (including vulnerable school-age girls) benefitting from scholarships. PEPFAR Haiti will soon be engaged in a pilot project to make scholarship programs more sustainable in the post-earthquake context in Haiti. In addition, the PEPFAR Haiti team has been working closely with the USAID/Haiti Economic Growth Team (EGE) in providing jobs for People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHAs). This cooperation is taking place in four cities with one partner and training on capacity building for people infected and affected by HIV /AIDS is taking place in Port-au-Prince with another EGE partner. PEPFAR Haiti has also been contributing to health activities related to TB prevention and screening at the main prison in Haiti. With PEPFAR support the prisoners have access to medical records, screening, X-ray and treatment for TB and HIV.

Health Systems Strengthening and Human Resources for Health

Health systems strengthening (HSS) has always been an important part of the PEPFAR Haiti program, although the challenges faced far exceed the resources available. In FY 2011, USG activities in systems strengthening will focus on fully aligning the program with the principles of the Global Health Initiative (GHI), the PF and the recently refined USG Haiti health strategy 2011-2015. PEPFAR Haiti will work with the MOH to meet the HSS goal in the PF by pursuing a policy agenda and activities that focus on the seven priority areas, including leadership and governance, health financing, management of service delivery programs, finances for a particular set of technical areas (HIV/AIDS, laboratory surveillance, maternal and child health, and family planning), health information systems, health workforce, and supply chain management.

To improve leadership and governance, the USG will support the MOH in: i) working with the Health Sector Table to propose a new "organic law" that will improve the MOH's organizational structure and allow it to improve its management capabilities; (ii) activities undertaken jointly by the central and the departmental levels aimed at rendering effective an expanded package of services in selected USG development "corridors", and (iii) a minimum package of services (PMS) outside of the corridor areas. This support will include consensus workshops at the MOH, and gap analysis. Support will also be provided to develop information systems for routine operations at each administrative level in the MOH.

In addition to strengthening the management of service delivery at four university teaching hospitals, eight departmental hospitals, 14 community reference hospitals (CRHs), and 33 clinics, the USG, in conjunction with the MOH and other donors, will identify two or three health networks in which support will be provided to ensure the availability of needed commodities (ARVs, CD4 tests, reagents, condoms, TB drugs and TB screening supplies, and opportunistic infection drugs), adequate staffing, adequate training and supervision of staff, and regular reporting in hospitals and key community clinics to ensure continuity of care. Although expanded coverage is an essential feature of the USG assistance package, the PEPFAR Haiti program will pay careful attention to creating a sustainable capacity to improve the management and provision of quality health care and a culture of quality among health workers, community leaders, civil society, individual patients, and patients' families.

In order to improve health financing, the USG will invest in structures and systems at the departmental and communal levels that will enable decentralized financial decision-making; offer seed financing to kick start and operationalize new financing and contracting mechanisms; and ensure that all infrastructure



investments have a clear business plan, including an effective management structure and enhanced accounting systems.

PEPFAR Haiti will support strengthening the health workforce through engaging in public dialogue for public sector health worker salaries, and incentives to attract medical personnel to underserved areas. Increased emphasis will be put on pre-service training and rebuilding medical and nursing schools. Inservice training efforts underway will continue, with increased support to residency training programs in infectious disease, a nurse practitioner program, allied health professional training, a community health agent program, a laboratory technician program, and a Field Epidemiologic Training program (FETP). The Field Epidemiologic Training Program (FETP) will be the innovation of Strategic Information (SI) training. The program will build capacity for using data for decision making both at the site and departmental levels. Ongoing workshops targeting health care providers and field data personnel for basic training on Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) data collection and reporting will move forward.

As the USG begins moving towards a single platform for project implementation, the evolution of a national Health Management Information System (HMIS) will continue. It is expected that the newly piloted standardized tools and web-based network for reporting clinical care programs will be rolled out countrywide and that the revitalized sentinel surveillance system will be expanded throughout the country. The USG, in coordination with the MOH and other donors, will also explore how to establish a strong government-led medical product and essential commodity logistics system. Both technical assistance and funding will be provided at the central and the departmental warehouses to reinforce their warehouse management, accounting, and distribution capacity.

Additionally, support will be given to establish strong pharmaceutical management capacity in the MOH, including capability for setting pharmaceutical policies and best practices in pharmaceutical quality, rational use of medicines, post-marketing surveillance of the quality of medicines in the market, improved provider practices in drug selection, and counseling and patient adherence to drug regimens.

Coordination with Other Donors and the Private Sector:

The USG and the Global Fund are the largest bilateral donors to Haiti's health sector. Other donors who contribute to the fight against HIV/AIDS in Haiti include the European Union, France, Canada, Brazil, and UN agencies, including UNICEF, UNFPA and WHO/PAHO.

The USG, in collaboration with other donors, assists the MOH in strengthening systems and building capacity in three areas: (1) establishing a fully MOH-staffed governance unit to plan and manage performance-based contracting for services and manage external funds supporting service delivery; (2) consolidating critical management systems functioning under MOH supervision, covering human resources and workforce development planning; logistics of medicines and medical supplies; health care financing; disease surveillance and health information reporting; quality improvement of services; and governance, with an emphasis on sustainability; and (3) training critically needed medical, nursing, midwifery, and allied health professionals and community health workers and placing them under proper supervision and working conditions nationwide.

Discussions surrounding the establishment of a National AIDS Commission have started with the USG, UNAIDS, UNICEF, the GOH, and other key stakeholders. The National AIDS Commission has the mandate to be Haiti's primary HIV/AIDS coordinating body. However, the process has not moved forward as planned. When a new government is in place, there should be a better chance for progress towards the goal of establishing a multi-sectoral commission by 2011.

Finally, the USG meets regularly with the principal recipients of Global Fund to carry out joint planning and reviews of implementing partners/sub-recipients' activities, to preclude any duplication of funding and/or reporting of results. The USG is a voting member of the Global Fund Country Coordinating



Mechanism (CCM) and participates fully in all meetings, discussions and decisions. Additionally, PEPFAR Haiti meets regularly with key officials in the Ministries of Health, Education, Women's Affairs, Sports and Youth, and Social Welfare to ensure that USG support complements and supports the overall Haitian plan for HIV/AIDS prevention, care, and treatment. In FY 2011, the USG team will work with the Haitian Coalition of Women against HIV/AIDS as one of the main civil society partners that can help to better address gender issues in HIV/AIDS activities.

Programmatic Focus

PEPFAR funding for FY 2011 will be focused on the following programmatic areas to achieve the 3-12-12 goals:

1. Prevention: The USG will continue to work in partnership with the GOH while contributing to strengthening the technical capacity of in-country partners to implement effective HIV/AIDS prevention interventions nationwide. The prevention portfolio focuses on prevention of mother-to-child transmission (PMTCT), abstinence and being faithful programs, and other behavioral prevention interventions, including those that focus on high-risk populations and blood and injection safety programs.

In FY 2011, the USG team will continue to focus its efforts on increasing the adoption of safer sexual behaviors among sexually active youth, men and women, particularly those in multiple concurrent partnerships (MCP), and among the most at risk populations (MARPs), including sex workers, transport workers, police and others in uniform, person living with HIV and AIDS, men who have sex with men (MSM) and others who have frequent, unprotected, casual sexual transactions. The PEPFAR Haiti team's strategy aims to promote social and normative changes and increase preventive behaviors among the sexually active population, while reinforcing abstinence and being faithful activities. A comprehensive package of programs will offer intensified preventive interventions to include sexually transmitted infection (STI) treatment, voluntary counseling and testing, discordant couple counseling, and family planning services targeting MARPs and sites with high prevalence of risky sexual behavior.

Societal expectations and norms about appropriate male and female behaviors, characteristics, and roles profoundly shape the epidemic in Haiti. Therefore, prevention activities will be designed to better address underlying gender dynamics and norms. Interventions will also address sexual violence and link gender-based violence activities to income generating activities, especially for women and other vulnerable populations. A special emphasis will be placed on key border towns with a high volume of movement between Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

USG support to MOH resulted in an increase in blood collected from 9,000 units in 2004 to 27,500 units in 2009. However, following the earthquake, the National Blood Supply Program (NBSP) and the Haitian Red Cross (HRC) lost the majority of the national supply of blood when the NBSP/HRC Blood Repository collapsed. In FY 2011, PEPFAR Haiti will provide support to rebuild the Blood Repository and increase its capacity to collect, test, store and distribute blood and blood products. In addition, PEPFAR Haiti will provide technical assistance; continue to support strengthening of GOH policies, systems, and human capacity; and provide essential supplies and equipment for blood production. PEPFAR Haiti will also continue to support the establishment of donor cells in order to increase the pool of regular donors. A network of mobile collection teams is being developed to increase the collection capacity of the blood transfusion system to accommodate the increased number of voluntary donors. This strategy is in line with the goal of meeting the national need and the long term goal of achieving 90,000 units of blood a year as outlined in the WHO standards.

In FY 2011, USG support to MOH will strengthen the procurement, distribution and disposal medical products and waste. Support will be provided to improve the procurement of safety needles, syringes and sharp containers. There will be a strong focus on Health Care Waste Management, particularly on



improving the capacity of major hospitals to dispose of biomedical waste and on the acquisition of high capacity incinerators for 10 departmental hospitals throughout the country. Continued support will also be provided to develop and distribute behavior change communication materials to educate patients, health workers and the community about the need to use oral medications as alternatives to injections

PEPFAR Haiti's FY 2011 PMTCT strategy will strengthen the scope, quality and sustainability of PMTCT services through a variety of strategies. As the PMTCT norms are being revised in line with the new WHO guidelines, PEPFAR Haiti will provide support to the MOH's Family Health Direction for the dissemination and implementation of these norms. PEPFAR Haiti will also promote the PMTCT case manager approach and extend it to reproductive health services in order to ensure that all women seeking care at PMTCT sites have access to a full package of services and care. Activities will include supporting an increase in services to HIV positive pregnant women; continuing to improve maternal and reproductive care (including family planning, postnatal care, emergency obstetrical care and reproductive health services); and supporting postnatal follow up of all HIV exposed infants. FY 2011 activities will continue community and health education activities to raise awareness and demand for PMTCT services.

2. Care and Support: Care activities in Haiti include counseling and testing (CT), basic care & support, support to integrate TB and HIV programs, and support for OVC. The CT strategy for FY 2011 will include training and re-training of counselors, with an emphasis on specialized counseling for pregnant women and high-risk populations (HIV-discordant couples, prostitutes and partners, uniformed servicemen, and TB and STI patients). It will also include the application of an HIV counseling curriculum developed for pre-service training of nurses, psychologists, and social workers. The "opt-out" strategy for HIV testing will be further encouraged for all pregnant women in CT sites. Those who test positive will be referred to PMTCT services and a greater effort to follow-up these women will be made, ensuring that they receive appropriate anti-retroviral prophylaxis.

Care & support activities will comprise a package of care, services and community support to HIV-positive individuals and their families. Programs will be targeted to meet the needs of asymptomatic, symptomatic, and chronically ill/end-of-life populations. HIV/AIDS care and treatment centers are considered to be the catalysts for care, and will be the focus of enrollment and care activities for all HIV-positive individuals.

Emphasis will also be placed on providing high-quality clinical care for HIV/AIDS patients, specifically the management of opportunistic infections, nutritional assessment, and counseling and support for both adult and pediatric patients, in accordance with national and World Health Organization (WHO) guidelines for integrated management of adult illness (IMAI) and integrated management of childhood illness (IMCI). Clinical care & support services for HIV-positive children will be incorporated into selected sites as well. Funded sites will be further supported through human capacity strengthening; technical assistance; quality assurance; provision of palliative care drugs and supplies; and the provision of laboratory tests, supplies, and equipment.

At the community level, PEPFAR will link care and support activities to HIV/AIDS prevention, care, and treatment centers. Activities will include strengthening community based organizations (CBOs) and faithbased organizations (FBOs) to promote "positive living" and provide psychosocial, spiritual, nutritional, and other support to individuals and families affected by HIV/AIDS. The USG will continue to leverage World Food Program (WFP) in Haiti and P.L. 480 Title II partners resources to support the targeted distribution of food to individuals and families living with HIV/AIDS. USG partners will also complement this food aid with assistance to individuals and families, following dietary assessments and the identification of ways to address continued nutritional and food deficits.

Support groups that have been organized throughout the country for PLWHA play an important role in providing care, education, and support for treatment adherence at both the clinic and community levels. Stigma reduction will be addressed through information, education, and communication materials and



other efforts targeting health care providers, caregivers, and communities surrounding HIV/AIDS care and treatment sites. Care and treatment sites located in towns along the Haiti/Dominican Republic border will work closely with sister hospitals in the Dominican Republic to ensure effective referral systems and cooperation in palliative care services. Cross-border collaboration also will take place between the CBOs that provide home and community-based palliative care and support.

The USG will continue its work to integrate Haiti's TB and HIV/AIDS programs in FY 2011. The strategy for TB/HIV integration includes conducting provider-initiated clinical and diagnostic HIV counseling and testing for all persons with TB as part of standard TB care; screening of all HIV-infected persons for active TB disease as part of the routine clinical care of HIV-positive persons at palliative care sites; and establishing strong patient referral system between TB clinics and HIV/AIDS care and treatment centers for HIV-infected persons.

In FY 2011, the USG will support FBOs and NGOs in working with orphans and vulnerable children (OVC) throughout the country to provide a basic package of care and support. The package will include potable water, immunizations, access to health care and psychosocial support, provision of school fees and supplies, dietary assessment and nutritional support, HIV prevention and life skill programs, and assistance with income-generating activities for foster families and care-givers. PEPFAR will continue to leverage use of P.L. 480 Title II resources to provide food assistance to OVC in USG-supported health networks. Priority will be given to providing basic child survival interventions for under-five OVC. In FY 2011, funds will address the vulnerability to HIV/AIDS of the increasing number of abandoned and homeless children on the streets of Port-au-Prince and other major cities. FY 2011 funds will also be used to continue funding for education, access to health care and identification of children, mostly birth registries. In addition, funds will be used to continue activities previously supported and funded by Track 1 OVC partners whose agreements ended in June 2010.

Finally, the USG will work closely on issues related to child protection such as family tracing and reunification in the post-earthquake context. Many PEPFAR OVC partners are already engaged with the Ministry of Social Affairs on these issues. The USG will work with partners to support policy changes on such OVC issues as inheritance rights, guardianship responsibilities, permission/authority for HIV testing of orphans when parents have died of AIDS, privacy rights, and protection from stigma and discrimination at school. The USG also supports and participates in a fledgling National Forum on OVC and HIV/AIDS.

3. Treatment: In coordination with the Global Fund, the USG will continue to work with the MOH and implementing partners to maintain and expand the antiretroviral (ARV) treatment program to reach the PF goal of providing antiretroviral drugs (ARVs) to at least 42,000 people by the end of 2013. This represents 85 percent of expected need. Over the past five years, the USG has built a strong partnership with the MOH and NGO service delivery networks (GHESKIO, PIH, AIDSRelief, MSH, ICC, I-TECH) to deliver a comprehensive package of ARV treatment services integrated in health primary care services. Since the inception of PEPFAR, there has been a steady increase of people enrolled on ARVs that has reached an average of 7,000 over the last three years. Following damage to the health care delivery system after the earthquake, there has been a net decrease (around 5,000) in the number of people enrolled on ARVs. With existing resources, particularly from the PF, steps are being taken to rebuild the health care delivery systems, in order to reach pre-earthquake levels of ARV enrollment and to rapidly expand the program.

At the policy level, the USG will support new norms that promote a new threshold of putting people on ARVs at CD4 < 350 and enrolling all TB patients on ARV treatment. At the service delivery level, the USG will continue to strengthen the capacity of Centers of Excellence (COEs) in HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment and care to supervise the peripheral centers and to offer training. In 2011, particular focus will go towards reinforcing lab services at COEs. All efforts will be made to expand ARVs at the most peripheral level by utilizing technical support from the COEs to reduce gaps and rapidly expand the

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number of people on treatment.

In order to sustain the HIV/AIDS program, the USG will invest additional treatment resources to reinforce global health activities at the different sites, particularly focusing on pediatric and maternal care. At the program level, resources will be allocated in conjunction with funding from the Global Fund to ensure continuous supply of ARV drugs. A particular emphasis will be placed on clinical training for both physicians and nurses to make trained clinicians available in infectious diseases and nurse practitioners available for task-shifting. The Electronic Medical Record (EMR) will be expanded to ensure that all patients are included in the EMR. Contingent plans will be developed to secure treatment in case of emergencies. This might include closer points of drug distribution to the population at departmental and local levels and reinforcement of the community tracking and communication system. With the technical arm of the COEs, the USG will continue to reinforce the technical and logistical capacity of the MOH to coordinate the program at all levels.

4. Woman and Girl-Centered Approaches: During FY 2010, PEPFAR Haiti initiated the reinforcement of maternal care and family planning services to support PMTCT by strengthening the capacity of PMTCT sites to provide high quality ante-natal care as well as improve capacity to provide emergency obstetrical care. In 2011, this support will continue and expand. An integrated package of PMTCT and reproductive health services will result in better quality of care for women.

During FY 2011, as part of its women and girl-centered approach, PEPFAR will continue to support services for women and girls affected by gender based violence (GBV), particularly in the internally displaced person (IDP) camps. Such services include not only reproductive health services but also psychosocial support and advice on how women and girls can adopt measures to increase their legal rights and protection. The USG will support the development of strategies and policies that tackle social norms fostering gender inequity. Support will be provided for HIV prevention campaigns that also address gender issues in order to improve young men's attitudes and reduce risk behaviors in ways that promote positive and equitable partner relationships. The USG will also work with other donors to support strategies that provide opportunities for women's empowerment.

Additionally, PEPFAR Haiti will support training for health care providers on GBV to reinforce their capacity to recognize signs indicating abuse in women as well as children. Health workers at PEPFAR Haiti supported sites need to be proactive in providing information on gender issues and sensitizing female patients on the importance of seeking help if in an abusive relationship. PEPFAR Haiti will design programs and activities which allow for greater equity as regards access to services to ensure that both women and girls receive quality care and support at the service delivery level. Such an approach will have a positive impact on the family overall, as women and girls represent a majority of household heads and are likely to be the generators of income at the household level; income which is then used to seek services related to health, education, and food. It is intended that programs for individuals and communities affected by HIV/AIDS will reflect a holistic approach to overall health and well-being. To this end, PEPFAR Haiti is committed to working across the health portfolio as well as with different mission sectors to ensure that women and girls' needs are incorporated in programs that affect institutional capacity building and service delivery to help to promote an integrated approach to HIV prevention and support services.

5. Other Programs (SI, HMIS, aligning program with PF, Human Resources for Health:

As mentioned earlier in the Health Systems Strengthening and Human Resources for Health section of this executive summary, Haiti will continue efforts towards creating a national HMIS and strengthening the health workforce using PF resources and in alignment with the goals outlined in the Haiti PF.

In addition, PEPFAR Haiti will continue to monitor and evaluate the progress of Haiti's national response to HIV/AIDS and PEPFAR and Global Fund achievements. These efforts will be directed at developing



and implementing information management systems for reporting on both programs and patients at the facility and non-facility level, as well as ensuring the continuation of HIV/AIDS surveillance (biological and behavioral) via population-based surveys such as the Demographic Health Survey, Behavioral Health Survey, and ANC Sero Survey. These surveys were scheduled to take place in FY 2010; however, following the earthquake, they have been postponed until FY 2011.

Following the earthquake, the platform put in place by the PEPFAR program rekindled a national surveillance system, which was dormant for years. As a result, MESI (Monitoring and Evaluation and Surveillance Interface) is being used to report surveillance data and surveillance officers have been hired at a few sentinel sites. In FY 2011, the plan is to streamline existing surveillance tools and make them more user-friendly, and expand capacity for reporting beyond sentinel sites by hiring and training more surveillance officers and by connecting MESI to cheap available technology such as Smartphone.

Efforts to implement HIV quality control at care and treatment sites will be expanded to all sites, giving providers the capacity to improve provision of services using data generated through their information system.

Management and staffing funds will support the in-country personnel needs for HHS/CDC, USAID, and State Department. Funds will ensure program monitoring and accountability, ensure USG policy and technical leadership within the Haiti national response, and cover compensation, logistics, office, and administrative costs. Staffing requests are outlined in detail in the separate M&O narratives.
